PROPOSITION 205

ROPOSED INITIATIVE RELATING TO THE EGULATION AND TAXATION OF MARIJUANA.

"yes" vote shall have the effect of permitting dividuals 21 years and older to privately use, assess, manufacture, give away, or transport up to 1 unce of marijuana and grow up to 6 marijuana plants the individual's residence; generally declaring olations of the Act (including public use) a petty fense punishable by no more than a \$300 fine; reating the Department of Marijuana Licenses and ontrol, which includes a 7-member Marijuana ommission appointed by the Governor, to regulate nd license entities involved in cultivating, nanufacturing, distributing, selling, and testing narijuana products; granting local jurisdictions limited uthority to enact ordinances and rules to regulate narijuana and marijuana products; establishing censing fees for marijuana establishments and evying a 15% tax on all marijuana and marijuana oducts; and declaring all marijuana establishment ontracts enforceable notwithstanding any conflict th federal law.

"no" vote shall have the effect of retaining existing w, which prohibits individuals from using, ossessing, growing or purchasing marijuana,

nless the individual is authorized by and oing so in compliance with the Arizona Medical Marijuana Act.

PROPOSITION 206

ROPOSED INITIATIVE RELATING TO ARIZONA'S INIMUM WAGE AND EARNED PAID SICK TIME ENEFITS.

A "yes" vote shall have the effect of increasing the minimum wage from \$8.05 per hour in 2016 to \$10.00 per hour in 2017, and then incrementally increasing the minimum wage to \$12.00 per hour by the year 2020; entitles employees to earn 1 hour of paid sick time for every 30 hours worked with limits based upon the size of the employer, broadly defining the exactions under which paid sick time may be taken conditions under which paid sick time may be taken, including mental or physical illness, care of a family member, a public health emergency, or absence due to domestic violence, sexual violence, abuse or stalking; prohibiting various forms of retaliation against employees for exercising any rights under the iw; and requiring employers to provide various otices to employees about the law.

"no" vote shall have the effect of retaining the xisting minimum wage (along with the existing nethod for annually increasing the minimum, rage for inflation) and retaining employers' xisting ability to determine their own earned aid sick leave policy.
